The Grand Reopening highlighted Homes for the Brave's ongoing investment in strengthening its housing, clinical, and vocational programs. The expanded space will enable the organization to serve more individuals and continue providing the holistic, Veteran-centered care that has been its hallmark for over 20 years.
